



## **ADOPTION STATEMENT – LOCAL PLAN 2018**

In accordance with Regulation 26 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 notice is hereby given that East Lindsey District Council adopted the East Lindsey Local Plan, comprising of a Core Strategy and Settlement Proposals Development Plan Document on 18<sup>th</sup> July 2018.

East Lindsey District Council`s Local Plan (the Plan) was submitted to the Secretary of State for independent examination on the 18<sup>th</sup> April 2017. Planning Inspectors Jeremy Youle BA (HONS) MA MRTPI and Louise Phillips MA MSc MRTPI were appointed by the Secretary of State to undertake the examination with the public hearing sessions held between the 12<sup>th</sup> July and the 4<sup>th</sup> October 2017.

A number of modifications were made to the Local Plan pursuant to section 23 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. The main modifications were confirmed by the Inspectors appointed by the Secretary of State and are set out in the published Inspector`s Report. A number of additional modifications have also been included as necessary technical changes resulting from representations received during the public consultations and at the hearings sessions held in 2017. The main and additional modifications may be viewed on the Council`s website [www.e-lindsey.gov.uk/localplan2018](http://www.e-lindsey.gov.uk/localplan2018) . The recommended main and additional modifications have been included in the adopted Local Plan which now carries full weight in the consideration of planning applications and replaces the East Lindsey Local Plan (1999) policy documents.

Any person aggrieved by the Local Plan may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that:

- (i) the East Lindsey Local Plan is not within the powers conferred by Part 2 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004;
- (ii) a procedural requirement of the Act or its associated Regulations has not been complied with.

Any such application must be made promptly and in any event not later than the end of the period of six weeks starting with the date on which the Local Plan was adopted.
